# Livestream: Green Public Procurement Pledge

Under this new pledge, governments commit to buy clean steel, providing massive incentive for companies to invest in new, clean production capacity. Leading steel producers Canada, Germany, India and the United Kingdom launched the Green Public Procurement Pledge, setting benchmarks for low-emission materials in public construction projects, and committing to identify flagship projects to use such materials. #### Solar World Initiative Launch

Launched today, the CEM Solar World Initiative will see a global coalition working together to help ensure that solar industry supply chains are secure, resilient, and sustainable. The coalition includes the governments of Australia, Germany, India and the United States – some of the largest solar markets in the world – in partnership with multilateral organisations International Solar Alliance (ISA) and International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA), and industry leaders such as the European Solar Manufacturers Association.
